Some programs set up an admissions committee who make these recommendations, and other programs the entire faculty will evaluate the candidates.

3A	How does your department orient new students to graduate study?	The department has a new student orientation prior to the start of classes. In addition, the Clinical program has an additional orientation meeting.

3C	Describe the process by which a student selects or is assigned a dissertation chair.	This process is largely student driven. Students choose chairs based upon shared research interests and availability.
